








#### **#1: Cataracts**

Age-related clouding of the eye's natural lens

Risk factors for early or rapid cataract development: diabetes, trauma, smoking, steroid use, radiation around head/eyes, family history.

### Cataracts

Cause blurry vision which is constant

Glare or haloes when looking at lights, out in bright sun, driving at night



Blurriness from early cataracts can be improved with new glasses

Glasses <u>do not</u> improve glare or halo symptoms



Cataracts usually progress very slowly (months to years) Nearly impossible to go 'blind' from cataracts Cataracts are <u>not</u> associated with pain, redness, itching or foreign body sensation in the eyes







Over time, cataracts may get too cloudy to be able to be overcome by simply a new pair of glasses

At this point, the only option to improve vision is with surgery

Cataracts <u>do not</u> require treatment unless visual symptoms are problematic to the patient to affect their day-to-day activities






Leading cause of blindness in the world

Cataract surgery is the most commonly performed surgery in the US


10 million surgeries annually worldwide


#### **Cataract Surgery: Laser-Assisted**



1. Laser applied to perform clear cornea incision.



Laser applied to make an opening in the capsular bag that surrounds the cataract



 Laser applied to fragment cataract into hundreds of tiny cubes, inside the capsular bag



 Vacuum inserted through the clear comea incision to remove the fragmented cotaract



5. Injector for the implant inserted into the capsular bag



## **Cataract Surgery: Lens Options**

Many options

- No perfect lens
- Every patient is not a candidate for every lens

Monofocal lens

Toric lens (moderate or high astigmatism)


**Multifocal Lenses** 

Light Adjustable Lens (LAL)




#### **Cataracts**

After cataract surgery – Posterior capsular opacity (PCO) "Secondary cataract" - months to years after surgery




#### #2: Glaucoma

Occurs due to optic nerve head damage, causing loss of peripheral vision, and in severe cases, blindness

Second leading cause of blindness in the USA

Glaucoma occurs when pressure in the eye is <u>too high</u> and causes damage to delicate structures that are important for vision








High eye pressure is <u>not</u> related to high blood pressure

Risk factors for glaucoma include family history, age, race (African American and Hispanic), chronic steroid use, elevated eye pressure, history of other eye problems or eye surgeries







Unless your eye pressure is *extremely* high (>40) you will not be able to feel if your eye pressure is above normal

Therefore, routine eye exams with your doctor who will measure the eye pressure are necessary

Methods of measuring eye pressure: "puff", "blue light"





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Some patients can have elevated eye pressure (>21) without suffering from any vision loss – Ocular HTN

The only way to know if there is damage to the eye from high eye pressure is to do non-invasive imaging tests in the office




#### Glaucoma

Eye pressure goes **up and down throughout the day**, so one abnormal reading is not always a concern

Your doctor may ask you to return to the office another day at a different time of day to recheck your eye pressure

If the eye pressure is persistently elevated <u>and/or</u> there are abnormal findings on the glaucoma tests, your doctor will likely suggest treatment for glaucoma

Once the eye has already suffered vision loss from glaucoma, that lost vision cannot be restored  $\mathfrak{S}$ 

The goal of treating glaucoma is to prevent further vision loss

Glaucoma usually starts by affecting **peripheral vision first**, which most patients do not notice in early stages

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#### **Glaucoma Treatments**

#### **Eye drops to lower pressure**

Dosed at one, two, or three drops per day depending on the type


# Laser procedure to open up the drainage system

Certain types of glaucoma are more responsive to this than others

#### Surgery (last resort)

Inserting drainage tube into eye to remove excess fluid and lower pressure








#### Glaucoma

If you are diagnosed with glaucoma, you will require life-long follow-ups (usually multiple visits per year) and repeat tests to monitor vision loss





## **#3: Macular Degeneration (AMD)**

A degenerative condition affecting the central part of the retina (macula) resulting in distortion or loss of central vision

Fatty deposits can develop in the macula, usually do not affect vision much ("dry")

As these fatty deposits progress, blood vessel can grow into the macula, which can cause bleeding and scarring ("wet")

This usually leads to central vision loss while peripheral vision is spared

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### **Macular Degeneration**

Risk factors: age, family history, smoking, obesity, heart disease, race (Caucasian)

Your doctor will perform a full eye exam looking for changes in the macula

They may require a non-invasive, in-office scan of the macula to confirm the diagnosis






### **Macular Degenerationn - Treatment**

**"Dry" form** observation, over-the-counter eye vitamins, STOP SMOKING

Studies have only shown that these vitamins only prevent progression once a patient <u>already has</u> dry macular degeneration (do not prevent disease from developing in the first place)

"Wet" form may require injections into the eye








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#### **#4: Floaters**

Vitreous jelly in the back of the eye is a solid, cohesive ball when we are young, but starts to shrink and break into pieces as we get older


Pieces of gel that break free and float around in the back of the eye can cast shadows on the retina, causing you to perceive 'floaters' in your vision





#### **Floaters**

Floaters can be of various shapes (circular, string-like, web-like) and usually move around with gaze Floaters can move in and out of your line of sight No safe way to remove floaters








#### **Floaters**

Very rarely, the moving jelly can tug on the retina and cause a <u>retinal tear</u> <u>+/- retinal detachment</u> which needs emergent treatment


Warning signs: numerous new floaters, flashes of light, peripheral vision loss ("veil")



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#### **#5 Diabetic Retinopathy**




**Prevention and treatment:** CONTROL BLOOD SUGARs and BP – HgbA1c goal <7.0 Kremer Eye laser, intraocular injections, surgery

## #6: Dry Eye

Inadequate tear film on surface of eye due to:

- A) Too few tears (not enough water layer)
- B) Tears evaporating too quickly (not enough oil layer)







## **DRY EYE COMMON SYMPTOMS**



Stinging or burning



Excessive tearing



Sandy or gritty sensation



Episodes of blurred vision

#### Preserved vs. Preservative-Free Artificial Tears








## **Dry Eye Treatments**

Improve natural oils (made in eyelids) in tear film

- Warm compresses to open oil glands up
- Lid washes/scrubs to clean debris that are blocking oil glands
- Break from screen time











#### Plug tear drainage system (punctal plugs)
